#### ÖRHK-SUMMER SCHOOL 2016 – GENERAL INFORMATION

#### **Duration:**

4<sup>th</sup> – 10<sup>th</sup> of September 2016

#### Venues:

Ural Federal University (UrFU), Ekaterinburg

#### **Short description:**

After three successful events in Raabs an der Thaya (2013 and 2015) and Moscow (2014), the ÖRHK Summer School returns this year to the Russian Federation. Originating from the EU-financed project "Cultural Landscapes and Identities along the Czech-Austrian Border", this Summer School addresses students and young scholars of the field of History and International Relations from the CIS and the EU. At the heart of the Summer School stands the scientific exchange of thoughts, aimed at generating a better understanding of each other's scientific traditions, research agendas but also culture, which should help to reduce mutual prejudices.

#### Proposed meta-topic: "History and Memory":

Cultivating historical memory through interpretations of a shared, if frequently conflict laden past may give us a sense of what we have in common and what separates us. This year's Summer School in Ekaterinburg in the Urals, a city perched on the border between Europe and Asia, will deal with key themes of European—Russian history in the 20th century and offer an opportunity to visit several local commemorative places in the spirit of Pierre Nora's lieux de mémoire. Various aspects of the cultural, ideological and political borders separating Western and Eastern Europe will be taking centre stage. These comparisons, however, will be aimed at foregrounding the complexity of the web uniting Western and Eastern Europe rather than divisive aspects.

## **Goals of the Summer School:**

- opportunity for young researchers to present their research topics;
- discussion of the research topics of young scientists;
- commentary of senior scientists on the research projects of young scientists;
- scientific discussion of the general theme "History and Memory";
- getting to know the region of Ural;
- international networking of young scientists;
- potential conceptualization of future international research projects.

#### Lingua franca:

English.

#### Workshops:

- Every participating young scientist is asked to present his/her research project or research topic in a speech of about 30 minutes. Besides an introduction to the topic, the presentations should put special emphasis on sources used and methods applied. The form of the speeches can be chosen freely; beamer and flipcharts will be provided. The general theme "Memory and History" should, but does not have to be reflected in the presentations.
- Every presentation will be shortly commented upon by a senior scientist and then discussed by the fellow participants of the workshop. Again, especially the sources analyzed and the methods applied should be in the focus of discussion.
- In the course of the workshops, individual senior scientists will be asked to give short presentations of approximately 30 minutes with methodological/source-critic content or regarding the general theme "Memory and History".
- Furthermore, cooperation in future research projects should be discussed and planned during the course of the workshops.
- The tentative timetable shown on the next pages is a general frame for the course of the workshops and will be followed with the needed flexibility.

## Lodging/field trips:

- Students will be lodged during the workshops in the University's dormitory. UrFU will provide breakfast, lunch and drinks/snacks during the coffee brakes. Dinner and individual drinks are not covered.
- After the workshops the participants are free to discover Ekaterinburg and its surroundings or to participate in common leisure time activities.
- A scientific/cultural supporting program will be organized, especially excursions to the center of Yekaterinburg, the border between Europe and Asia etc. on Tuesday 6<sup>th</sup> of September, including all meals and basic drinks.
- On Monday 5<sup>th</sup> of September, all participants of the Summer School are invited to the Colloquium "Historical Memory in Europe and Russia" at the UrFU.
- The supporting program should foster the informal networking and getting to know among the scientists.
